When: June 18 – July 2

Where: Camp of the Peaks, in the Alps near the Italian border.

Team size: 6-8 people

Ages: Youth & adults

Estimated cost: \$1600

Missionaries: Lynn & Rose Lindquist (GEM)

Ministry: The Camp has recently build an extension to the Grand Chalet, to house an elevator that would allow handicapped people to use their facilities. The main structure and roof are in place, but they need help getting the interior finished and ready to use. Tasks could range from hanging doors, tiling, installing electrical outlets and light fixtures, painting, etc.

Also, it would be great if there were a few people that could help with household type work, like meal preparation and spring cleaning.

Lodging: The team will stay in the Chalet. This building has 6 bedrooms, a kitchen, a living area and a common shower and toilet room.

Belgium

When: March 10-27 & October 8-28

Where: Zaventem, a suburb of Brussels, within 5 minutes from the Brussels International Airport.

Team size: 10-15 people

Ages: Youth & adults

Estimated cost: \$1500

Missionaries: Jan & Melinda Wisse (OM), Jonathan & Grace Meyer (OM)

Ministry: We will primarily be helping with the ongoing renovations of OM's conference facility (ZavCentre). No experience is required as the type of work will be catered to the skill sets of the individuals on the team. Tasks could include carpentry, plumbing, electrical work, welding, tiling, painting, sorting and moving storage items, demolition and clean-up.

Specifically in March we will be helping renovate the main kitchen, as well as some other tasks, in order to bring the building up to standard with the new fire safety codes.

Lodging: Everyone will be staying, eating and serving at ZavCentre. Accommodation is dormitory style with bathrooms at the end of the hallway. Couples do get their own room!

Peru

When: May 2016

Where: In and around Huaraz

Team size: Maximum 12

Ages: 12 and up

Estimated cost: \$2000

Missionaries: Larry & Sandy Rockwell (MTW)

Ministry: We will be helping with minor construction projects around the Center. This could include painting, tiling, plumbing, carpentry, etc. In the afternoon or evenings, there will also be opportunity to visit with local families.

Lodging: The team will stay at the MTW Center, which has apartments and dorm rooms. Very comfortable, hot water, food cooked on the premises, laundry facilities available.

Medical: To prepare for this trip folks might want to talk with a doctor about high altitude precautions. Many get a prescription for Diamox to start taking before arrival. We are at 10,000 above sea level, traveling to villages of 12,000 feet and at times over passes of 16,000 feet.

Swaziland

When: May 5-15

Where: Mbabane, Swaziland

Team size: 6-7 people

Ages: Adults

Estimated cost: \$2200

Ministry: We will be working with The Luke Commission (TLC -- lukecommission.org). They are a remarkable group who entered Swaziland at the height of the African AIDS epidemic in the early 2000's and currently serve nearly the entire country with week-long medical brigades.

Thousands of Swazis are blind from preventable and treatable causes. Our primary role will be logistics and surgery for over 150 patients as a means for sharing the saving love of God. No experience is needed. Just a love for Jesus and a desire to help.

Travel & Lodging: Travel is long but a remarkably fun adventure. We will be staying in mission houses with good food and comfortable accommodations. Swaziland has been the most stable country in the entire continent of Africa. The Swazi people are wonderfully hospitable and the country is a safe environment for visitors and missionaries.

Mexico

When: July 8-15

Where: Juarez

Team size: 8-10 people

Ages: All ages including kids

Estimated cost: \$1100

Missionaries: Jamie & Jennifer Burkemper (MTW)

Ministry: The team will be continuing the construction on Torre Fuerte's new church building in the mornings, a siesta after lunch to cool off and recharge, and then return to the community surrounding Torre Fuerte where the team will participate in an English Camp. The Camp is more like VBS where the team members will be leading the kids in the areas of music, sports/games, crafts, and Bible. The construction will be mostly on the interior of the building and could include sanding, painting, light electrical work, etc.

Lodging: The team will be staying at La Quinta Inn hotel, located close to the US consulate where they provide a buffet consisting of eggs, fruit, yogurt, etc... Lunches and dinners will be prepared by the churches, excellent authentic Mexican cuisine!

Where: Greystones, just south of Dublin

Team size: 2-4 people

Ages: Adults

Estimated cost: \$2200

Missionaries: Frankie & Sonia Riley (Serge)

Ministry: The primary work of Serge in Ireland consists of walking alongside Irish church leaders and supporting them as they lead local congregations. You are invited to go meet those leaders and spend time praying with them for the broadening and deepening of the church in Ireland. See what God is doing in and through the Irish church as you intercede and encourage.

Lodging: You will be staying at a Christian retreat center called Coolnagriena. Some parts of the prayer summit will occur at the center, but you will also be going out to various churches and ministry sites around Ireland.

Team size: Flexible

Ages: All ages including kids

Estimated cost: \$500*

Missionaries: Scott & Ruth Hill (MTW), Norman & Julie Beck (MTW)

Ministry: This year, we will be leading morning programs, Bible clubs & crafts, at Agelink childcare. Agelink is located 5 miles from the campground where we will be staying. By being the hands and feet of Jesus, we hope to strengthen the church's presence in the community, and create opportunities to share the Gospel with children and adults.

Lodging: Teams will be housed in cabins that have bunks and mattresses. A common bath area is shared. There are some family cabins available that are self-contained with toilet, shower and sink.

Also, by meeting, worshipping and dining with, and by working with various ministry partners there, we will begin to build relationships which we hope to further grow in the coming years. There will also be plenty of opportunities to go sightseeing in Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Nazareth, Jordan River Valley, Galilee, Dead Sea, Qumran, etc.

Lodging: Comparable to a two star hotel.

Team size: 4-8 people

Ages: Youth & adults

Estimated cost: \$1500

Missionaries: Ian & Darlene B. (MTW)

Ministry: We will be helping the new church plant explore downtown Kuala Lumpur by conducting surveys and developing new relationships, in order to pinpoint how to best minister to the needs of the city and share the Gospel.
